

About the Institute

The National Institute of Health and Family Welfare is a premier autonomous Institute, funded by the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India. It has kept pace with the new thinking and substantially contributed to the health manpower development in the country. NIHFV serves as an apex 'technical institute' as well as a 'think tank' to promote national health and family welfare programmes in the country through education and training, research and evaluation, consultancy and advisory services, specialized projects, etc.

Location of the Institute

It is situated in South Delhi, near Jawaharlal Nehru University and Munirka DDA Flats. It is easily accessible from the Indira Gandhi International Airport and the New Delhi Railway Station, approximately 10 kms. and 15 kms. respectively. Pre-paid taxis/auto-rikshaws are available

Basic Education

The educational activities of the Institute contribute to health manpower development for better management of health and family welfare programmes in the country. These courses are need based and multidisciplinary in nature. They include (i) Three year post Graduate Degree M.D. In Community Health Administration; (ii) a two year Post Graduate Diploma in Health Administration; and (iii) Six Courses of Post-Graduate Diploma in Health and Family Welfare

Management, Hospital Management, Health Promotion, Health Communication, Public health nutrition and applied Epidemiology through Distance Learning. These are of one year duration.

Training and Workshop

The training courses and workshops (intra-mural and extra-mural), numbering around 80-100 organized by the Institute every year aim at (i) familiarizing the participants with the goals and objectives of health and family welfare programmes; (ii) updating their knowledge and understanding of operational difficulties in implementation; and (iii) suggesting remedial measures to overcome such constraints.

Research and Evaluation

The Institute gives priority attention to research work in different aspects of health and family welfare.

Specialized Services

Specialized services of the Institute include clinical, documentation, printing and publications. The clinical work in relation to infertility, reproductive disorders, especially endocrinology and sexual dysfunctions deserve mention. The reference, referral, press clipping and bibliographic services of NDC and the publication, art and projection services of the department of communication compliment the activities of the Institute.
