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1. ABOUT THE NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF HEALTH AND FAMILY WELFARE

The National Institute of Health and Family Welfare (NIHFW), was established on 9th March, 1977. The NIHFW, an autonomous organization, under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare, Government of India, acts as an ‘apex technical institute’ as well as a ‘think tank’ for the promotion of health and family welfare programs in the country. The Institute addresses a wide range of issues on health and family welfare from a variety of perspectives through the departments of Communication, Community Health Administration, Education and Training, Epidemiology, Management Sciences, Medical Care and Hospital Administration, Population Genetics and Human Development, Planning and Evaluation, Reproductive Bio-Medicine, Statistics and Demography and Social Sciences.

The institute is actively involved in conducting academic programs- both on-campus and e-Learning. Apart from Master of Public Health, it also offers other on-campus programs like Post Graduate Diploma in Public Health Management, MD (CHA), DHA and PhD program. The institute also offers a range of Distance Learning courses including, Post Graduate Programs in Public Health Nutrition.

2. BACKGROUND OF THE PROGRAMME

The public health system in India can be strengthened through the presence of well-trained and competent public health professionals. Qualified public health professionals are a necessity to achieve the Sustainable Development Goals. Such an interdisciplinary public health workforce can also advance the vision of Universal Health Care. The aim of our MPH program is to make public health education and research activities relevant to India in content and context, while attaining standards which are qualitatively comparable with the best in the world. The National Institute of Health and Family Welfare (NIHFW) is pleased to announce its call for applications for MPH for the academic year July 2024 - June 2026, affiliated to Faculty of Medical Sciences, University of Delhi (DU).

3. UNIQUENESS OF THE PROGRAM

This public health program is a blend of basic and advanced principles of public health and their application in health sector. This program delivered by NIHFW in partnership with University of Delhi aims to deliver wide range of courses in key areas of public health, competency-driven curriculum, linkages with public health practice, emphasis on problem solving, case-based learning, use of innovative pedagogy and focus on transformative learning. The MPH program offers fieldwork, internships, and research engagement opportunities where student can apply their knowledge and skills in real-world settings. This hands-on experience would enhance students’ practical competencies, build their professional networks, and prepare them for the challenges of public health practice. Successful completion of the MPH program would equip the graduates to assume leadership roles in public health organizations and drive positive change in the field.

4. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The MPH program is an intensive two-year full-time program focusing on enhancing skills and abilities of students in research, management, problem solving, and critical thinking in the area of public health. The four semesters include classroom-based, face to face teaching, tutorials, practical (computer lab and public health activities in community), internship and dissertation. The student needs to successfully complete the coursework and the project work to be awarded the MPH degree.

5. LEARNING OBJECTIVES

The course will help candidate to develop skills in the following areas:

- Analytical and assessment skills for collecting and interpreting information
- Policy planning and development skills to address public health challenges.
- Communication skills for advocacy, dissemination of public health data and information
- Financial planning and management skills for running public health programs in the country
- Leadership skills to lead teams of public health managers.

6. LEARNING OUTCOMES

At the end of this program, the following core competencies will be acquired by the candidates:

- Apply contemporary ideas to influence program organization and management, problem solving and critical thinking in public health domain
- Undertake public health research including operational research in institutional and field settings
- Work in socially, culturally and economically diverse populations by being attentive to needs of vulnerable and disadvantaged groups and be well versed with existing health systems
- Demonstrate qualities of leadership and mentorship
- Be an effective member of a multi-disciplinary health team
- Demonstrate ethics and accountability at all levels (professional, personal and social)
- Practice professional excellence, scientific attitude and scholarship
- Demonstrate social accountability and responsibility
- Contribute in policy development and analysis in health
- Be open to lifelong learning

7. RATIONALE

Despite significant achievements over the years, Public Health challenges continue to stretch the existing resources, both in India and in the world. The countries, across the globe, strive towards achieving the Millennium Development Goals, yet the agenda remains unfinished. With the commencement of Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) era, a renewed thrust is required to maintain and improve upon the progress achieved so far.

The development of managerial competencies is presently not a part of the formal medical/para-medical educational system. The standard MD (Community Medicine) courses offered at medical colleges impart the managerial skills and competencies expected from public health managers at sub-district, District or State level but the avenues for these MD professional are numerous including joining medical colleges. Most of the MD (Community Medicine) post graduates would not like to join the health systems at a junior level with lower salaries. Hence, there is an urgent need to devise programs that would develop specific competencies related to Public Health Management and impart knowledge, skills, and change attitudes to address & resolve key health management challenges.

There are also issues of Scale i.e. the number of qualified public health personnel produced in various programs is still quite small – typically, institutions like the Achuta Menon Centre for Health Sciences at Sri Chitra Tirunal, Trivandrum; the Tata Institute of Social Sciences, Mumbai; the Indian Institute of Health Management & Research, Jaipur etc., have a limited annual intake of participants in their 2-year public health/health administration programs.

This course will be an attempt to prepare competent cadre of professionals who have a basic understanding of the various aspects of public health and are able to successfully apply this knowledge towards meeting public health challenges in Indian context.

8. GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS FOR CANDIDATES

This Syllabus contains brief extracts of the Ordinances, rules and regulations of the as approved by the University of Delhi. The candidates should, therefore, acquaint themselves with the relevant ordinances, rules and regulations of the University regarding eligibility requirements, payment of fees, attendance, examination and other matters pertaining to the MPH course.

The various terms and conditions mentioned in the Prospectus are subject to the change made in the Ordinances, rules, and regulations by the University of Delhi from time to time as per the decision of the Academic Council/ Executive Council and also binding regulations/ directions of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare (Government of India) and/or University Grant Commission, AICTE etc.

The University of Delhi reserves the right to amend the Ordinances, rules and regulations at its discretion as and when considered necessary.

The candidature for MPH courses is strictly provisional and mere appearance at the CUET will not entitle the candidate for admission, which will be subjected to candidate's fulfilling all the requirements for admission. Those candidates, who are not eligible, would apply at their own risk and would not be entitled for admission and if at a later stage, it is detected that they are not eligible as per rules, the registration and admission of such candidates will be invalid and no fees will be refunded.

Further, if any information furnished by the applicant is found fraudulent, incorrect or untrue, at any time during admission / course/ after completion of course, he/she shall be liable to criminal action; it will entail disqualification and shall render the candidate unfit for admission without any notice. The candidate shall abide by the Rules and Regulations of the NIHFV/Faculty of Medical sciences, University of Delhi.

In case of any dispute, the decision of the Director, NIHFV shall be final. However, an appeal may be filed with the Dean, Faculty of Medical Science, University of Delhi against such a decision.

The in-service candidates shall submit No Objection Certificate (NOC) from their employer to the effect that they have No objection and the candidate will be relieved/ granted study leave for pursuing the course. This should be submitted at the time of reporting for admission.

After declaration of result, a candidate who is in service and who is likely to get admission, should initiate the process of obtaining Study Leave/ getting relieved so that he/ she is able to join the course concerned by the stipulated date.

No candidate shall be allowed to join a course unless he/she has been relieved/ sanctioned study leave from his/ her employer.

No TA/DA will be admissible for any purpose w.r.t. admission procedure in MPH Course at the NIHFV.

The selected candidates will be required to undergo medical examination by a qualified medical practitioner at their own cost or by a medical board constituted by the institute for the purpose. A candidate found medically unfit for the course will not be allowed to join the course and his/her admission would be cancelled. The Director NIHFV reserves the right not to admit any candidate in the course.

For all the legal matters, the jurisdiction will be the National Capital Territory of Delhi only.

Candidates should preserve the Fees receipts till the course is over.

9. DEGREE AWARDING AND REGISTERING BODY

The National Institute of Health and Family Welfare in affiliation with University of Delhi brings you this unique opportunity to further your career in the area of public health through the Master of Public Health program. 10. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

The Indian National who have graduate qualifications in:

- A) Medicine, AYUSH, Dentistry, Nursing, Veterinary Sciences, Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Nutrition, Allied and Health Sciences from government approved Universities/Institutions are eligible. Applicants with graduate qualifications in: Life Sciences, Biotechnology, Statistics, Biostatistics, Management, Demography / Population Studies, Sociology, Psychology, Anthropology, Social Work, Economics or any equivalent qualifications.
- B) Applicants should have a minimum of 50% marks/equivalent grade in the qualifying bachelor's degree examinations.

11. DURATION OF THE COURSE

This course is designed to be a 'two years' full time program including internship and dissertation.

12. NUMBER OF SEATS & SELECTION PROCESS

MPH course is initially offered with an intake of 20 students at NIHFW.

All prospective candidates need to appear for the CUET (PG) examination for MPH Programme conducted by the National Testing Agency (NTA). The merit will be prepared based on scores obtained in the Common University Entrance Test (CUET). The details of test paper code and description of pattern and syllabus for MPH Programme will be as per NTA Information Bulletin (CUET-Postgraduate) for the subject Public Health.

Reservation of seats in admissions will be as per the norms of the University of Delhi.

13. PROGRAM STRUCTURE

The MPH program is an intensive two-year full-time program focusing on enhancing skills and abilities of students in research, management, problem solving, and critical thinking in the area of public health. The MPH course will comprise of 15 Core modules and four elective modules. Four elective streams comprising five modules each have been identified in addition to 15 Core modules.

A candidate will need to pass 15 Core (compulsory) modules, and five elective modules of the chosen stream to successfully complete the program.

14. INTERNSHIP

Two months' internship will be undertaken by all the candidates with an aim to integrate learning and practice in an active public health organization. This can be undertaken at governmental or non-governmental public health organizations or program management units. The internship should include the candidate's role and support in assessing, monitoring, or conducting surveillance of health problems/services in a population; research on population-based health problems; developing and/or implementing policies and intervention strategies to meet public health needs. Overall, it should contribute to the organization and should help in understanding public health management and coordination and gaining personal confidence and leadership experience. Although finding a suitable internship opportunity lies with the candidate him/herself, mentors will facilitate the process. After the completion of 2 months of internship, candidates will be expected to submit a brief summary of public health program/challenge dealt with and solution proposed/implemented by the candidate at the end of second semester.

Candidates should submit their project plan and preliminary time scale with their chosen topic for dissertation at the end of the internship to their mentor/tutor to seek appropriate approvals before embarking on the full investigation and project.

15. DISSERTATION

At the end of the fourth semester, candidates will submit their dissertation on previously chosen and approved topic for assessment. The dissertation will be evaluated by an internal examiner (50% weightage) and an external examiner (50% weightage) including a viva-voce during the final examination.

Each participant, working under close guidance of a faculty advisor, will develop a major project as part of the course work. The project will be carried out over a period of 4 months constituting the final semester. The participant will be supervised by a faculty advisor. The experience has three primary components: a protocol, a written project paper, and an oral presentation. The participant will be evaluated concurrently on the study protocol, while the study is in progress and terminally on the dissertation.

The protocol will be framed between the student and the faculty advisor and will be preferably based in the setting of the participant's area of functioning in the health service setup. The protocol will be formally designed, and the draft will be submitted for review. The review will be conducted by a formally designated committee for this process and will perform an ethical and a feasibility review of the work plan. Necessary changes, if any, will be conveyed to the participant who can be requested to resubmit to a repeat review till the approval is obtained.

The study plan after approval will be executed by the participant during the allotted four months (2 months for data collection & 2 months for analysis and documentation) for dissertation work. Any difficulties that arise during the dissertation work will be reported and suggestions sought from the faculty advisor.

The dissertation writing will include the following headings; Introduction, objectives, review of literature, management challenges, methodology, results and observations, discussion and conclusion/ recommendations.

16. PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION AND LANGUAGE

The program utilizes a variety of teaching/learning techniques, which include lectures using Audio-Visual aids, demonstrations, group discussions, and presentations by students. Hands-on practice in computer-based applications and statistical software using computers will be imparted in several courses. The main language of instruction would be English. During the internship, the students will get an opportunity to engage in research related activities conducted at a public health research organization, an NGO, a hospital or a laboratory.

17. SPAN PERIOD

As per the semester scheme of University of Delhi, the span period to complete the course shall be four years from the date of admission in 1st semester.

18. ATTENDANCE REQUIREMENT

No student shall be considered to have pursued a regular course of study unless he/she is certified by the Head of the Department to have attended 75% of the total number of lectures and seminars conducted in each semester, during his/her course of study. Provided that he/she fulfils other conditions, the Institute may permit a student to the next Semester who falls short of the required percentage of attendance by not more than 10% of the lectures and seminars conducted during the Semester.

19. EVALUATION PROCEDURE AND COMPONENTS OF EVALUATION

Participant evaluation will comprise of internal evaluation during course work and performance in the final examinations.

Internal evaluation

Internal evaluation will be conducted at the end of each of the four semesters. This will comprise of evaluation of the theoretical knowledge and daily participation/ application skills of the candidates. The daily participation / application skills of the candidates will be assessed on the basis of class participation, assignments, class presentations or a course evaluation test. The theoretical skills will be assessed by a semester-ending examination that covers the modules taught during the semester. The internal Assessment would amount to 33.3% of the final marks. The candidate must obtain a minimum of 50% separately in theory and practical (internal Assessment) to be eligible to sit for the final examination.

Dissertation

A student will be permitted to appear for the final term examination only after he/ she has scored 50% in his/ her dissertation.

Final Examination

The final examination will comprise of a theory exam, practical assessment and viva- voce. 4 theory papers and 4 Practical exercises will be administered in Epidemiology, Biostatistics, Health Management and Health Promotion/Communication.

A participant will have to secure at least 50% separately in the theory and practical assessment for obtaining the degree.

Final and Semester end examinations will be under supervision of examination branch of the University of Delhi.

20. DIVISION CRITERIA

A student who passes all the papers prescribed for Semester I to Semester-IV examination would be eligible for the degree. Such a student shall be categorized on the basis of the combined result of Semester I to Semester IV examination as follows:

75% or more: Distinction

60% or more: First Division

50% more but less than 60%: Second Division

21. PASS PERCENTAGE

Minimum marks for passing the examination in each semester shall be 40% in each paper and 50% in aggregate of a semester. However, a candidate who has secured the minimum marks to pass in each paper but has not secured the minimum marks to pass in aggregate may reappear in any of the paper/s of his choice in the concerned semester in order to be able to secure the minimum marks prescribed to pass the semester in aggregate.

22. PROMOTION CRITERIA

- i) Semester to Semester: Students shall be allowed to be promoted from Semester I to Semester-II provided she/he has passed at least half of the modules of the current semester.
- ii) Part I to Part II: Admission to Part II of the program shall be open to only those students who have successfully passed at least 7 papers out of papers offered for the part I courses comprising of Semester I and Semester II taken together (10 papers). However, she/he will have to clear the remaining papers while studying in Part-II of the program.

23. TEACHING METHODS

This program will be interdisciplinary both in its content and teaching. It will utilize a basket of teaching/learning techniques such as simulation exercises, Lecture discussion, group discussion, tutorial, demonstration, case studies, role play, collaborative learning, hands-on training on computers, assignments, visits to organizations of public health interest, field work, practical and field projects. Apart from classroom teaching students will be actively involved in seminars and Journal clubs. Faculty with diverse backgrounds, national and international experience combined with a breadth and depth of public health experience would be engaged to impart teaching learning experiences.



24. FACULTY

A team of experienced and multidisciplinary faculty from NIHFW would be engaged in teaching. The students will also be exposed to lectures delivered by invited faculty and a pool of adjunct faculty with NIHFW of national and international acclaim. Guides may be identified from the NIHFW/University of Delhi/other reputed public health institutes for mentoring during internship and project work (with dissertation).

25. PROGRAM FEES

The annual course fee for students admitted to the MPH program is ₹1,25,000 per student per academic year. The first-year course fee shall be paid through the University of Delhi admission portal, while the second-year fee will be submitted directly to the NIHFW. An additional Examination Fee of Rs. 4,500/- per semester for all 4 semesters and Rs. 4,500/- for the final examination will also have to be paid by the student.

26. REFUND POLICY

Admission Fee on account of withdrawal of the admission by the candidate will be refunded completely only if the withdrawal has been made before the last date of admission, as announced by UoD. Admission fees for withdrawals made after the last date of admission will not be refunded in any circumstance. Refunds will not be made for the following: a) CSAS(PG)-2024 Application Fee. b) Mid-Entry Fee. c) Withdrawal Fee.

27. PLACEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The project work and internship during the MPH program would provide the candidate with an opportunity to interact with potential organizations for employment. The Placement cell at NIHFW supports the placement process by identifying relevant career opportunities for those who are seeking placement assistance. However, no formal guarantee would be provided to any candidate regarding future job selection after completion of the program.

28. FACILITIES

Accommodation

The candidates selected for admission to Master of Public Health course may apply for hostel accommodation at the Institute and may be provided hostel facilities as per the availability on payment of scheduled tariffs. However, they may also make their own arrangements for stay outside the NIHFW during the period of their studies.

Library

The National Documentation Centre (NDC) is the backbone of the institute supporting Research work, education, teaching and patient care. NDC has a collection of more than 55000 documents which includes books, bound journals and theses (MD (CHA), DHA, PGDPHM and Ph.D.) as the print material. The library subscribes to many databases which include major publishers like Elsevier, Lippincott, Wiley, Springer, BMJ, Karger, Oxford, ASM, Taylor & Francis etc. and softwares like TURNITIN for plagiarism check, Grammarly, Endnote, SPSS on demand of our end users. The OPAC services for in-house collection are also available in library. The library has a separate reading room facility for the residents and members of the library.



Computer Center



NIHFW has a Computer Centre with facilities for data analysis, programming and Computer Assisted Learning (CAL). The Institute has established Campus Wide Area Network and computerized different units in the Institute. Five powerful servers are hosted in the computer centre, connecting 300 PCs in the campus. The Computer Centre

has well-equipped computer labs for teaching/training purposes. Computer training is provided to staff, students and participants of various courses.

29. DISCIPLINE

- The students shall submit themselves to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and several authorities of the University which may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Act, the Ordinance and the Rules that have been framed by the University from time to time.
- The student would undergo the course on full-time basis; no private practice, part-time job being permissible during the duration of the course.
- University can remove the name of the student from the rolls in case his/her work or conduct is reported to be not satisfactory by the Supervisor/Head of the Department/Head of the Institution.

30. STUDENT GRIEVANCE CELL

The NIHFW has constituted a mechanism for redressal of students' grievances related to academic and non-academic matters, such as infrastructure, hostel, any kind of discrimination based on caste, or any other issue. Any student can submit their grievance to the student grievance committee to report the problem and can also propose a solution for the same.

31. RAGGING

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of the institute as well as on public transport. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under the Ordinance XV-C of the University of Delhi.

32. SEXUAL HARASSMENT

Any complaint regarding sexual harassment will be dealt as per the DoPT Guidelines issued time to time. The Institute has Sexual Harassment Committee dealing complaints received by the Director as per rule.
