#### Introduction

Nurses and midwives representing the largest section of healthcare workforce are the important drivers of any healthcare system. By virtue of its proportion and potential, the nursing and midwifery profession has the unique ability to provide effective care across the broad continuum of healthcare. In order to ensure that nurses and midwives can practice to their full extent of potential, it is essential to provide them with the opportunities for building and adopting leadership positions in healthcare system. The World Health Organization (WHO) in collaboration with the International Council of Nursing, announced year 2020 as the 'International Year of the Nurse and the Midwife' and launched the Nightingale Challenge 2020 as a celebration to mark 2020 Year of the Nurse and the Midwife. This challenge aimed to work with healthcare employers worldwide who will enable 20,000 young nurses and midwives to join leadership and development programmes and build their skills as practitioners, advocates and influential leaders in healthcare. It is aimed that building global leadership of this most important workforce will be crucially important to achieve the objective of universal health coverage by 2030.
